Registration Policies

POLICIES

1. All sessions must be purchased in their entirety and are non transferable.
2. Sessions may be cancelled due to test days or Hockey Tournaments. Also subject to change and/or cancellation.
3. Skaters should commit to an energized work ethic that enhances the training environment.
4. Proper attire and grooming is required for all on ice and off ice sessions. For on ice, hair should be neat and tight, gloves and RCV jacket (or zip up jacket with no hood) are a must. Skirts and tights for girls, skating pants for boys. Off ice attire as outlined by the off ice instructor.
5. The Director of Skating has the right to place skaters on another session due to a membership situation.
6. During a free skate session a coach instructing has the complete right of way. The soloist will be identified and have the right of way. It is also understood that right of way will be given to skaters receiving a lesson.
7. Skaters must make every effort to be on time. If late, they must report to the Director of Skating.
8. No swearing, bullying, temper tantrums, unsportsmanlike conduct or other inappropriate behavior will be tolerated. Do not put others at risk by kicking the ice. Do not stand or coast in the middle of the ice, be aware of a fast moving session.
9. Coaches and off ice instructors have the right to dismiss skaters for lateness or inappropriate behavior.
10. The Director of Skating has the right to dismiss any skater displaying inappropriate behavior; after 3 dismissals, it will be brought to the RCV executive's attention and this may result in the athlete being suspended from the Racquet Club of Victoria Figure Skating Club without refund.
11. No parents coaching at rink side.

OFF-ICE TRAINING

Off-ice training is essential for all skaters to reach their maximum potential as a skater. The RCV off ice program promotes injury prevention by including stretch, strength, dry land jumping, ballet and theory to prepare all skaters physically, mentally and technically for success on the ice.

VOLUNTEER PARTICIPATION

The expectation is that all families will contribute to the club for various tasks that might otherwise fall on only a few members or cost the club money to perform. Each family is required to sign up for a least two activities during skating year. Concession duty is

mandatory for all families.

LIABILITY AGREEMENT

The skater, or if the skater is under 18 years of age, the skater and the parents/guardians agree: The skater skates at his/her own risk. The skater will not hold the RCVFSC and its officers or employees responsible for any loss or damage sustained through injury to the skater, or other skaters on or off the ice or any other liability loss, damage or expenses incurred as a result of the skater attending the RCVFSC Fall/Winter 2009-2010 season. The skater will abide by the rules of RCV and Skate Canada. All fees for skating booked will be paid in

advance. The RCVFSC reserves the right to use a skaters' photo or likeness for publicity and/or promotion. Coaching fees will be paid within 7 days of receipt of bill and paid in full prior to trying test(s).
